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Evacuation Order Issued for the Town of Palm Beach

Palm Beach County has issued an emergency evacuation order that will go into effect on barrier islands on November 9 at 7:00 a.m.

The Town of Palm Beach remains under a Hurricane and Storm Surge Warning. A hurricane warning means hurricane-force winds (sustained winds of 74 – 95 mph) are expected in the area within 36 hours. A Storm Surge Warning means there is a possibility of life-threatening inundation from rising water moving inland from the coastline in the warning locations during the next 36 hours. Waterfront property owners are encouraged to assess and document pre-storm conditions before any potential storm surge arrives. A flood watch has been issued for the area effective 7:00 am on November 9. A Flood Watch is issued when favorable conditions for a specific hazardous weather event occur.
